

Stautzenberger College's Brecksville Campus to Offer Medical Assisting Program with Two Options!

This fall, Stautzenberger College, Brecksville, is proud to launch its Medical Assisting Programs! These Programs include both a Diploma option and an Associate of Applied Science option, enabling students to achieve a basic skill level, move into the work force, and continue toward their degrees while supporting themselves.

As home to some of the world's best medical institutions, Northeast Ohio offers medical assistants generous opportunities. Even in a market noted for its job losses, the medical assistant field is projected to continue growing. In fact, the field is expected to grow over 33% by 2018.

Medical Assistants perform a range of administrative and clinical tasks. The diversity of their responsibilities is tied to their critical role in the medical office: to them falls the responsibility to ensure that the offices of physicians, podiatrists, chiropractors, and other health practitioners run smoothly.

Administrative duties include such tasks as completing

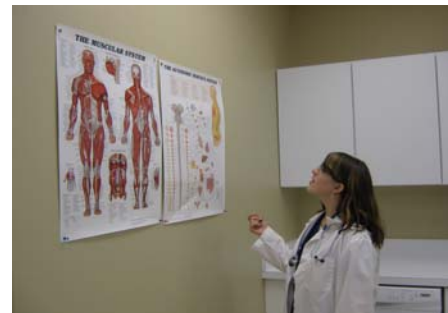
forms, answering telephones, and handling billing and bookkeeping. The clinical side includes recording vital signs, taking medical histories, explaining treatment procedures to patients, and assisting physicians during examinations. Depending on the size and scope of the practice, a medical assistant may be able to specialize in a particular area.

In a competitive field such as medical assisting, communication skills and an understanding of current technology are vital. Stautzenberger College, Brecksville's programs have been designed with those needs in mind.

The Diploma is configured to allow students to earn 58 credit hours of courses chosen to enable them to hit the

ground running. The Associate Degree option offers 98 total credit hours of education for those wishing to expand their experience and their opportunities. This program includes twice the number of Externship opportunities and a greater emphasis on communication skills. Both paths give students the opportunity to learn from seasoned professionals who provide the hands-on training that is grounded in the skills vital to a successful medical assistant.

Stautzenberger College, Brecksville, is excited to announce that attorneys no longer need to face the hassles and costs of venturing downtown to fulfill their CLEs! High parking fees can now be but a bad memory!

Beginning this fall, the College is launching a new Continuing Legal Education program that will enable attorneys to meet their biennial requirements at less cost and greater convenience. Acting Judge Christopher Greene, Esq., the College's Paralegal Studies Program Director, has spearheaded the effort to offer CLE seminars approved by the Supreme Court of Ohio. Each of these seminars will satisfy continuing education requirements.

Timely topics include Domestic Relations (marriage/divorce) Law and Case Law Review, A Review of U.S. Supreme Court Decisions of the 2008-2009 Term, and How to Appeal a Case.

The program will feature such speakers such as Judge James Celebrezze, Magistrate Scott Kitson, and Magistrate Valerie Bradenburg, both Domestic Relations Magistrates. Seminars are designed to provide attendees with essential knowledge.

The cost will be \$60 per credit hour. Participants will benefit from case law reviews, how-to sessions, and round tables with experienced individuals who are experts in their field.

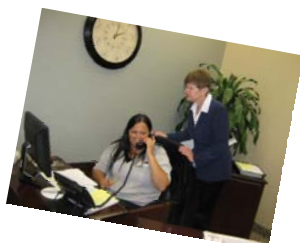

Pharmacy Technology Program is Ready for Winter Quarter Enrollment!

Early 2010 saw great changes for our Pharmacy Technician and Medical Assisting facilities. In keeping with the tradition of offering our students the latest in technology, the College invested nearly \$100,000 in a new lab to support these programs. With the new facility now complete, our Pharmacy Technology Instructor, Laura Martino, CPhT, is eagerly anticipating the start of Winter Quarter 2011!

The field of pharmacy technology has received a lot of media attention recently because of the passing of SB 203, otherwise known as Emily's Law. According to the National Pharmacy Technician Association, on February 26, 2006, a pharmacy technician at Rainbow Babies & Children's Hospital prepared her own compound of normal saline base solution instead of using a ready-made solution. That compound became the base for the

final chemotherapy treatment of 2-year-old Emily Jerry. Little Emily was poised to be discharged following this treatment; her prognosis was excellent. Sadly, instead of receiving a base solution of 0.9% NaCl (sodium chloride), the compound that was delivered to her included 20 times the standard concentration. Instead of going home, Emily died from a fatal overdose of sodium chloride. Because of this tragedy, the Ohio Legislature increased oversight and practicing requirements for the field. The trend toward greater licensure requirements and regulation is growing nation-wide.

Education is a vital part of ensuring sufficient numbers of qualified Pharmacy Technicians. "People who have an interest in the medical field, who want to learn about medications and how they work, who are focused, who are excellent multi-taskers, and

who just enjoy helping people will make fantastic pharmacy technicians," said Ms. Martino. "Plus, considering the intimate size of the program, I know that students will appreciate the very personalized experience we can give them." Ms. Martino noted "a Pharmacy Technician has so many options, and people who may be considering the field should not limit their thinking to the retail side of pharmacy technology only."

Stautzenberger College, Brecksville joins Pharmacy Technicians across Ohio in welcoming Emily's Law, which was passed by Ohio Governor Ted Strickland in 2009. There are now very specific requirements for a pharmacy technician to be considered qualified in the state of Ohio, and one of those requirements is passing an exam approved by the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy. Stautzenberger's

Pharmacy Technology Program is designed to exceed that minimum standard, preparing students to take the national certification exam instead. This will allow our graduates to practice as pharmacy technicians nationwide.
