

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Between
St. Petersburg College
And
Stautzenberger College

The intent of this Agreement is to facilitate the transfer and transition of Associate Degree graduates ("the students") from Stautzenberger College, 8001 Katherine Boulevard, Brecksville, Ohio, 44141 and 1796 Indian Wood Circle, Maumee, Ohio, 43537 (hereinafter referred to as "Stautzenberger") into the Bachelor of Applied Science in Veterinary Technology at St. Petersburg College, P.O. Box 13489, St. Petersburg, Florida 33733-3489 (hereinafter referred to as "SPC"). This Agreement will allow students to earn college credit at Stautzenberger that will transfer to the SPC Bachelor in Applied Science in Veterinary Degree Program.

STAUTZENBERGER COLLEGE TO ST. PETERSBURG COLLEGE

1. This Agreement is to facilitate the acquisition of the baccalaureate degree for graduates of Stautzenberger's Associate of Applied Science – Veterinary Technology Degree Program.
2. This Agreement is based upon students' successful graduation from Stautzenberger College's AAS – Veterinary Technology Degree.
 - a. Before being accepted into the SPC Bachelor of Applied Science in Veterinary Technology Program, the students must have received an Associate's degree in Veterinary Technology from Stautzenberger, to include general education and Gordon Rule requirements as applicable, with a grade point average of 2.0 or better. It is further understood that Stautzenberger students must earn a minimum of 15 hours of general education credit from a regionally approved college or university prior to acceptance at SPC.
 - b. Stautzenberger students seeking admission to the BAS – Veterinary Technology Degree program without an acceptable Associate's degree will be treated in accordance with regular SPC policy for transfer students.
 - c. Any student transferring into SPC from the Stautzenberger program and following the specifications of this Agreement will be eligible for admittance into SPC's Bachelor of Applied Science in Veterinary Technology Program as a junior with completion of all prerequisites listed in 2a. It is also agreed that students graduating from SPC will be required to meet all requirements for the baccalaureate degree, to include thirty-six (36) hours of college level general education coursework and two semesters of the same foreign language in college or two years from high school. In addition to the 15 hours of general education credit, students from Stautzenberger College may elect to complete all or part of their remaining general education requirements at a regionally accredited college or university prior to enrollment at SPC, or complete them at SPC as part of the baccalaureate program. If the students elect to transfer his/her general education credit, SPC's baccalaureate specialists will advise students on which specific courses will transfer for credit. Such advising will be available to Stautzenberger students for both the 15 hours of general education required for acceptance and the remaining 21 hours required for the baccalaureate degree.
 - d. It is understood that students must fulfill the SPC prerequisites for junior and senior level courses. Based on the Stautzenberger program from which the student is transferring, a minimum of 42 specified credit hours must be completed at SPC to receive a Bachelor of

Applied Science in Veterinary Technology. SPC agrees to provide an academic advising report to each Stautzenberger student accepted into the Bachelor in Applied Science in Veterinary Technology program detailing specific coursework required to complete the degree.


- e. A minimum overall grade point average of 2.0 in all college level course work is required for acceptance by SPC. Transfer courses may include those courses completed through recognized proficiency testing programs (e.g., CLEP, ACT-PEP) or completed by alternative acceleration mechanisms acceptable to SPC and Stautzenberger.
- 3. Students may be admitted with an A.A. degree with approval by the Dean and completion of all prerequisites listed in item 2 above.

Terms of Agreement

- 4. This Agreement is based on current curricula offered by St. Petersburg College and Stautzenberger College. Curricular changes by either institution that affect the terms of this Agreement must be agreed upon by both parties in written amendment.
- 5. This Agreement will be effective at both institutions beginning January 1, 2011 and remain in force through January 1, 2014, unless otherwise terminated by either party as set forth herein, subject to the conditions included in item 4. This Memorandum of Understanding may be extended by written agreement of the parties signed by appropriate authorized persons from the respective institutions.
- 6. This Memorandum of Understanding may be terminated by either party upon ninety (90) days prior written notice of the date of termination. If this agreement is terminated, it will not affect students enrolled in and accepted into the SPC program at the time of termination, nor will it affect the status of students who have already matriculated into the Bachelor of Applied Science in Veterinary Technology Program, at St. Petersburg College.
- 7. Advertisements, press releases, flyers and other print or electronic publicity or signage on Stautzenberger property about services or activities related to this Agreement will be approved in advance by designated representatives of both parties. Recruitment services involving recruiters visiting students and classes will be approved in advance by Stautzenberger College and will be arranged by agreement of both institutions.
- 8. Any tutoring services that may be needed by Stautzenberger College graduates enrolled in SPC's School of Veterinary Technology Program will be arranged by separate agreement, once a demand has been identified.


